CanSkate Creative Improv

Creative Improv programs are designed only by the skater with minimal preparation. Creative Improv tests the skater's ability to quickly interpret a given piece of music and entertain the audience. ½ ice will be used.

- All the skaters in each flight for an event are presented with a pre-selected piece of music by the Chief Referee/Tech Rep prior to the warm-up. All skaters in the flight for that event will perform to the same musical selection.
- Skaters will listen to the music twice in a designated area (i.e., dressing room or players box) and once on-ice during the warm-up period.
- Skaters are then kept in a sound-proof dressing room until it is their turn to perform.
 - 1. CREATIVE IMPROV CANSKATE— a 30 second piece of music, ½ ice
 - a. Skaters may not have passed any STARSkate skills assessment

CanSkate Team Event Elements

- a. Two-foot spin
- b. Three forward Power Jumps
- c. 2 ft Jump forward to backward or backward to forward
- d. Forward Spiral

Event Registration

Online registration for Stony on Ice 2022 **closes THURSDAY MARCH 3, 2022** at 11:59 pm. Late Registration will no be accepted.

Planned Program Sheets

Any entry in STAR 5 to Gold, Pre-Juvenile to Pre-Novice, MUST upload a Planned Program Sheet upon registration. Planned Program Sheets will NOT be accepted on site.

Refund Policy

Refunds will be given up to and including the registration deadline, however, they will be subject to a \$50 administrative and online processing fee. No Refunds will be given after the closing date of entries of the competition. NO medical refunds at any time after the registration deadline.

On Site Registration

Skaters must register no later than 60 minutes prior to their first event of the day.

Coaches

It is the responsibility of the coach(es) to ensure that they meet the requirements to be able to attend a competition with their athlete. <u>Please click here</u> for important information surrounding certification requirements, requesting special permission and accreditation at the event.

For the CanSkate events only, a CanSkate In Training Coach may accompany their skaters on the ice.

Judging System

All STAR 1-3 events will be assessed to standard. STAR 4 level events will be assessed to standard and ranked. STAR 5 and higher events are supported by the Skate Canada CSS software and will be run using the CPC judging system.

Skate Canada CanSkate Events will be judged by a panel of 3 CanSkate qualified Program Assistants/Coaches.

Music

All skaters must upload their music in mp3 format upon registration through www.skatestonymountain.ca . Music must be uploaded to the site in the following format: FirstNameLastName_Category_Program_XmXs.mp3

For example: JaneDoe_PrejuvenileU11_Free_2m31s.mp3

Skaters are expected to have back up music in CD or USB format board side when they compete in case there is an issue with their music. Music will not be accepted onsite.

Awards

Skaters in **STAR 1, 2 and 3** events will be assessed to a standard (Bronze, Silver or Gold) and will receive a ribbon and feedback form. Skaters in **STAR 4** will receive a feedback form and medals will be presented to the top three finalists. CPC Report Cards will be given to all skaters and medals will be presented to the top three finalists in **STAR 5 to Gold and Pre-Juvenile to Novice** events. Skating attire is to be worn for pictures during award presentations.

CanSkate events will be assessed to a standard (Bronze, Silver or Gold) and will receive a ribbon and feedback form.

Accidents/Liability

Skate Canada, SCMB and Skate Stony Mountain and its volunteers undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by skaters. As a condition of and inconsideration of their entries in this competition, all competitors and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, or caused by or connected with, the conduct and managements of the competitions and to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, the association, the Section, Skate Canada, the Local Organizing Committee and against the officers and their entries shall only be accepted on these conditions.

Medical Services

Medical Services available to skaters will be located at ice level.

SCMB Camera Policy

Flash photography is not permitted. Skate Canada Manitoba restricts the use of cameras and video equipment during Skate Canada sanctioned events out of respect for the safety and to protect the privacy of competing athletes. Spectators are permitted to use cameras at the event for personal use only and are subject to the following conditions. Anyone who does not abide by these rules' risks having their camera confiscated by authorized personnel. Coaches are only permitted to videotape their own skater from the boards during that skater's practice or performance. Coaches cannot video tape from the spectator area.

- · No flash photography is allowed
- · Camera lens must not be larger than 200mm to avoid obstructing the view of other spectators
- · Any resale of photography or posting photos on websites is strictly prohibited
- · Video cameras can only be used by the parent(s) of their own skater during their performance
