CanSkate Creative Improv Event - Creative Improv programs are designed only by the skater with minimal preparation. Creative Improv assess the skater's ability to quickly interpret a given piece of music.

- 30 second piece of music.
- Full ice will be used.
- Skaters may not have passed any StarSkate Assessments.
- All the skaters in each flight for an event are presented with a pre-selected piece of music by the Chief Referee/Tech Rep prior to the warm-up.
- All skaters in the flight for that event will perform to the same musical selection.
- Skaters will listen to the music twice in a designated area (i.e., dressing room or players box) and once on-ice during the warm-up period.
- Skaters are then kept in a sound-proof dressing room until it is their turn to perform.
- Coaches will be allowed to assist skaters minimally during warm up

CanSkate Team Element Event

- a. Two-foot spin
- b. Three forward Power Jumps
- c. 2 ft Jump forward to backward or backward to forward
- d. Forward Spiral

Star 1 Team Element Event

- a. Waltz Jump
- b. Salchow Jump
- c. Forward Upright Spin
- d. Forward Spiral

Fun Events – OPEN TO STAR AND CanSkate skaters – Skaters will be grouped by level and age.

Team 1 foot sit glide – Consists of 4 skaters linked together in 1 foot sit glides. Scores will reflect creativity and the ability to hold the longest.

Team Spiral – Consists of 4 skaters linked together in unsupported spirals. Scores will reflect creativity and the ability to hold the longest.

Longest Waltz Jump – Jump distance will be measured from the point of take off to the point of landing.

Longest Spiral – A timer will begin when the foot reaches hip height and will stop when the free foot dips below the hip.

Longest 1 foot sit glide – A timer will begin when the skater enters the full sit glide position and will stop when the skaters begins standing up or falls.

Any entry in STAR 5 to Gold, Pre-Juvenile to Pre-Novice, and Adult Free skate & Artistic, **MUST** upload a Planned Program Sheet upon registration. Planned Program Sheets will **NOT** be accepted on site.

Refund Policy

Refunds will be given up to and including the registration deadline however, they will be subject to a \$50 administrative and online processing fee. No refunds will be given after the closing date of entries of the competition. No medical refunds at any time after the registration deadline.

On Site Registration

Skaters must register no later than 60 minutes prior to their first event of the day (no earlier than 45 minutes if the first event of the day)

Dressing Rooms

Dressing rooms will be All-Gender and assigned by event.

Coaches

Skate Canada Coaches who wish to receive accreditation from Skate Canada at Stony on Ice must meet the following conditions:

- Regional Trained or higher (STAR 1 and higher events)
- CanSkate Coach Trained (CanSkate event)
- Be a current Professional Coaching Member of Skate Canada.
- Coaches must register in person at the registration desk.

Judging System

Cumulative Points Calculation System

All STAR 1-3 events will be assessed to standard. STAR 4 events will be assessed to standard and ranked. STAR 5 and higher events are supported by the Skate Canada CSS software and will be run using the CPC judging system.

CanSkate Events will be judged by a panel of CanSkate Program Assistants.

Fun Events will be judged by a panel of current and former skaters in the spirit of fun! Skaters will be in small flights and will be ranked to receive medals.

Music

All skaters must upload their music in mp3 format upon registration to through the registration website. Music must be sent in the following format:

FirstNameLastName_Category_Program_XmXs.mp3

For example: JaneDoe_PrejuvenileU11_Free_2m31s.mp3

Skaters are expected to have back up music in USB format board side when they compete in case there is an issue with their music. Music will not be accepted onsite.

Awards

Skaters in STAR 1, 2 and 3 events will be assessed to a standard (Bronze, Silver, or Gold) and will receive a ribbon and feedback form. Skaters in STAR 4 will receive a feedback form and medals will be presented to the top three finalists. CPC Report Cards will be given to all skaters and medals will be presented to the top three finalists in STAR 5 to Gold, Pre-Juvenile to Novice and Adult events. Skating attire is to be worn for pictures during award presentations.

CanSkate events will be assessed to a standard (Bronze, Silver, or Gold) and will receive a ribbon and feedback form.

Fun events will be ranked to receive medals.

Camera Policy

Flash photography is not permitted while athletes are on the ice during practice or competition. Skate Manitoba restricts the use of cameras and video equipment during Skate Canada sanctioned events out of respect for the safety and to protect the privacy of competing athletes.

Coaches are only permitted to videotape their own skater from the boards during that skater's practice or performance.
